Rev. Dr. G. Wilson Gunn, Jr., General Presbyterian, National Capital Presbytery, is our preacher today. Dr. Gunn grew up in Arkansas. His faith was nurtured in this congregation from 1960 until 1975 when he moved his membership to Waynesboro, Virginia, just ahead of his beginning seminary. This church continued its encouragement of his ministry with scholarship support during his first year of seminary. His father was a campus minister at the University of Arkansas, and his grandfather was a pastor in Hot Springs. Dr. Gunn matriculated at Davidson College (BA), Duke University (MDiv and ThM), and the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill (PhD). He served pastorates in North Carolina and Virginia (including two new church developments) for 20 years before entering executive service in Grace Presbytery (NE Texas area). In March, 2004, he began serving National Capital Presbytery as General Presbyterian. Phil and Jan Butin and Wilson Gunn served the same congregation (the Nutbush Presbyterian Church, Townsville, NC) about a decade apart. Wilson and Phil share an educational background at Duke University. Dr. Gunn and his wife, Pam, have four children (Lisa, Daniel, Ben and Rachael) and one grandson (Jacob).

We are pleased to welcome Jayne Brewer, soprano, as our guest soloist this morning. Jayne is a recent music graduate from the University of Arkansas and is married to Andrew Brewer, grandson of Hugh and Martha Brewer.

The quilt on the Lord's Table has been graciously loaned to FUPC to enhance our summer worship series on the Psalms. It is entitled "Psalms II" and is the work of Ann Roberts. The blocks are verses from familiar Psalms and the border is Christ and the disciples at the Last Supper. You are welcome to come to the Table to view the quilt after worship. The season of Ordinary Time runs from June-November, and in the fall, the church's green paraments will be on the Lord's Table.
