*Know therefore that the LORD your God is God;
the God who maintains covenant faithfulness
with those who love him and keep his commandments,
to a thousand generations.” (Deuteronomy 7:9)*

When all is said and done, it is our commitments—made and kept—that make us who we are. This becomes clearer and clearer as we grow older.

Most of us have known at least a few people whose word is their bond; who consistently “say what they mean and mean what they say.” If you have, you know that promises made and kept are at the heart of our identity. Promises are made to be kept. If we know we cannot or will not follow through, we must not say we will. That seems to be what Jesus meant when he said, “Let your ‘yes’ be ‘yes’ and your ‘no’ be ‘no.’”

Of course, all of us know the disappointing reality of commitments not kept. In the fallen world we live in—marred by human self-centeredness—some promises simply cannot be kept for the good of all concerned. But the violation we all continue to feel when we find out someone has broken a vow or promise to us, or lied to us, or deceived us shows we still know in the core of our being the importance of honoring our commitments, even if we can’t always do it. I remember how upset I would get as a child when a member of my family would tell me they were going to pick me up at a certain time or place, and then when the time came, they weren’t there. Research has shown that one reason so many young adults now live together for years before taking marriage vows is that they’re afraid to make covenant commitments because they fear they won’t be able to keep them. All of us have been on both the giving and the receiving end of some sort of broken promise or commitment, whether in business, or in the family, with a friend, or even at church. It doesn’t feel good.

In a world of broken promises, how can we as God’s people find the strength and the courage even to make promises, let alone keep them?

The biblical book of *Deuteronomy* will be the basis for our summer sermon series. It’s entitled: *Who God is, who we are: Making and Keeping Commitments*. The really interesting thing is that from beginning to end, Deuteronomy is written in the conviction that *God’s commitments are the only reliable basis for any and all human commitments*. God’s commitments—God’s promises—constitute God’s very being. We are created in God’s image. So our commitments—our promises—constitute our very being also. The biblical concept of “*covenant*” is central to the book of Deuteronomy. A covenant is a solemn commitment, sealed by vows, in which the parties to the covenant trust in the faithfulness of God to make and keep their promises. Scripture speaks of covenants with God, with God’s people, between tribes, between marriage partners and family members, and between individuals who have everyday interactions in the world.

We all need to place our trust in God alone if we are to be the people of integrity that our consciences and scripture—and most of all our faithful God—call us to be. Each week this summer, we’ll be learning from scripture how we can make and keep commitments, and in so doing—reflect the character and the being of our covenant-making and keeping God. Summer is a time of coming and going, but we will all want to worship at either 8:30 or 11:00 each week over the next several months, as together we learn more what it means to make and keep our commitments based on God’s own faithfulness.


