Be still and know that I am God (Psalm 46:10).

It was Rev. Susan Gray, pastor of Vaughn Presbyterian Church, who called our attention to this text at a morning devotional on centering prayer at our fall Session retreat. There hasn't been a day since the retreat that I haven't thought of this verse. Learning to pray this way has been a spiritually deepening experience.

What Susan really said to us was, "Be still and know that I am GOD," followed by, "Be still and know that I AM," and then, "Be still and know that I." I think you get the idea. By dropping one word from the end of the verse each time and pausing between repetitions, we finally come to, "Be STILL," and then, "BE." Simply BE.

Oh, to BE! Can we even imagine such serenity, such calm, such peace, such rest? Can our schedules ever slow down and halt long enough to BE? To BE before God? (*Pause.*) It's in the stillness that we hear God. When we're very quiet. When we listen. When we are attentive and reflective.


Susan also said, "There's an app" for this kind of meditation. You might want to check out "Centering Prayer" and follow the prompts for an enriching devotional life. If you don't use apps, you can simply center yourself prayerfully with the words of the psalm or another word like grace, peace, endurance, perseverance, or hope. You can find a quiet place and slowly say those words over and over, listening for God between repetitions. Either way, in the calm, you will encounter God.

Another way we've been thinking about how to simply BE is through the Moms' Group. With our discussions of MaryAnn McKibben Dana's book, *Sabbath in the Suburbs: A Family's Experiment with Holy Time*, we've recognized each week how hurried our lives can get. On a trip to Iona, Scotland, she and her husband reevaluated the pace, choices, and attitudes of their daily lives and covenanted that their entire family would try to take one day in seven off—a whole day—no matter what. She reframes the Sabbath, coining a new word, the adverb *Sabbathly*, to describe how they will learn to live. McKibben Dana writes,

"There are times when I don't feel restful. I don't feel the joy of the moment. I don't feel connected to God. But I believe that we can act our way into a new feeling. We can look at life, with its imperfections and annoyances, and change it for the better by acting as if it's already better. We can let our language guide us. Words do more than describe our reality; they also shape it. I need a new word: Sabbathly. ...we can notice the times that we are living Sabbathly and un-Sabbathly.... On the surface, it seems like a fakey thing to do. I'm not a fan of pretending. But living Sabbathly doesn't feel like pretending. Instead it feels like an act of hope. Sabbathly says, "I am a big, frantic, conflicted mess. But I am going to breathe, smile, and laugh. I am going to demonstrate my willingness to be peaceful. And that's a start."

As the seasons change, there's an excitement that comes from being with family and friends. I cherish those gatherings and relationships. I will be more cautious this year, though. At this, our busiest time ever, dare we even suggest a slower, more worshipful pace? Can we make a commitment to try to live Sabbathly? Will we try to call each day a holy event—an opportunity to "Be still and know that I am God" and simply "Be"?

Dedication Sunday will follow on November 13, as we "Glorify God in All Things" by offering our pledges of time, talent and treasure to God in worship.



FUPC AND FIRST SCHOOL MARRIAGE GROUP


